“STAGEDOOR TOUR: BEHIND THE SCENES AT RADIO CITY MUSIC HALL” ~ On this morning, participants will board the infamous NYC Subway for transfer to 50th Street at Broadway where they will enjoy a private guided behind-the-scenes tour of the ‘Showplace of the Nation’. In addition to the world-famous Christmas Spectacular and performances by countless legendary artists, since opening in 1932, Radio City Music Hall has been well known for its beautiful art deco architecture. Masterfully renovated in 1999, the entire venue was restored to its original glory from the carpet on the floor to the gold leaf on the ceiling. Participants will learn the history of the iconic Great Stage, view the stunning auditorium and lobbies, see the massive hydraulic elevators in action, visit “Roxy’s” apartment, and even meet a Radio City Rockette! ~ Attire for this event is casual - walking shoes and weather appropriate comfortable clothing are recommended. Following the tour, participants will return to the hotel.

“HIDDEN TREASURES OF GRAND CENTRAL TERMINAL” ~ On this morning, participants will board the NYC Subway for transfer directly into the heart of the city. Opened to the public on February 2, 1913, Grand Central is a world-famous beaux-arts landmark and transportation hub in Midtown Manhattan. Its rich history is a story of immense wealth and great engineering, but also of survival and rebirth. With more 750,000 visitors every day, Grand Central Terminal is one of the most-visited destinations in New York City, second only to Times Square, but its secrets are known by few! During this private guided tour, participants will explore the numerous passages of this architectural wonder to discover not only its fascinating history and convenient transportation options, but also its hidden gems including a tennis court and backwards ceiling to name a few. ~ Attire for this event is casual - walking shoes and weather appropriate comfortable clothing are recommended. Following the tour, participants will return to the hotel.

“GROUND ZERO: 9/11 TRIBUTE MUSEUM & MEMORIAL and ONE WORLD OBSERVATORY” ~ On this afternoon, participants will embark on a somber journey into the not-so-distant past to pay homage to lives lost as well as those surviving the tragic events of the day. Located within the archaeological heart of the original World Trade Center site, the 9/11 Museum serves as the country’s principal institution for examining the implications of the events of the day, documenting the impact of those events and exploring the continuing significance of September 11, 2001. Participants will be taken on a private guided tour of the museum, reflecting pools and One World Observatory. ~ Attire for this event is casual - walking shoes and weather appropriate comfortable clothing are recommended.
